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

The Rangoonwala Community Center Restructuring Project is currently in its planning phase with the designs approved for the relocation of the management offices, exteriors for the annexe building and the re-design of the Admissions Offices to better utilize the spaces within the Community Centre and enhance the overall customer experience. SCHOOL EVENTS

Jawan Champions:

During the YSTI sports event on November 28-29, 2023, our students demonstrated outstanding athletic abilities. Boys' teams earned runner-up and champion titles in various cricket and running categories, while the girls' teams won Danish Rounder at the district finals and secured the runner-up position at the city level. Their discipline and sportsmanship were highly commendable.







Summer Gala:

We closed the school year with a joyful "Summer Mela," blending a traditional fair with a live screening of a Cricket World Cup match. This memorable event brought our school community together for a day of celebration and fun.









Storytelling Event:

Our pre-primary students participated in storytelling presentations on December 8-9, 2023, showcasing their creativity in both English and Urdu. This event helped them build public speaking skills, express themselves, and grow in confidence. Their performances were warmly received by parents, teachers, and peers.



Alumni Get-Together:

Our first-ever Alumni Get-Together in June attracted over 300 attendees, providing a chance for former students to reconnect and network. It was also an opportunity to gather data on their achievements, helping inspire current students and keeping our school's records up to date.





Early Childhood Education (ECE):

From August 2023 to May 2024, our ECE training covered child development, assessment, and lesson planning. Based on valuable feedback, we continue to update modules to make practical applications more accessible for teachers. Graduates also received a complimentary 3-month ECE certificate course, covering responsive caregiving, health, nutrition, safety, and early learning. This course aligned with national curriculum standards, emphasizing diversity, engagement, and the creative arts.

Affiliation with AKU-EB:

We are thrilled to announce the successful completion of our affiliation with the Aga Khan University Examination Board. This affiliation has given our school access to free teacher training sessions and will ensure well-administered assessments, recognized by the Government of Pakistan. Beginning in May 2026, our students will take SSC exams through AKU-EB.



AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM:

Our inaugural After-School Programme, launched on September 5, 2023, provided students with enriching experiences beyond academics. This three-day-a-week program included activities like team sports, cooking, archery, coding, and fine arts, offering students from Classes 5-10 an exciting addition to their school routine.











ACADEMIC ACHIEVMENTS:

We are immensely proud of our students' dedication, with the majority meeting academic benchmarks. We celebrated another 100% pass rate in the SSC Board Exams! Aimen Hussain achieved the highest score in the Science group with 90.90%, and Sarrah Qureshi led the General group with 76.6%. These results are a testament to the commitment of our teachers, who continue to support and guide students in their academic journey.







As the Head of Vocational Education and the VM Centre for Traditional Arts (VMCTA), part of the ZVMG Rangoonwala Trust, I'm pleased to reflect on our progress over the past year. In the field of vocational education, we have seen significant growth in student enrollment, with a strong emphasis on IT programs. This increase demonstrates the growing demand for skill-based training and highlights our commitment to providing high-quality education in today's digital age.

At the same time, VMCTA continues to thrive as a hub for traditional arts. This year, we enrolled 173 students across 14 carefully curated courses, offered both in-person and online, with participants joining us from not only Pakistan but also from countries such as Saudi Arabia, Qatar, South Africa, North America, and the UK. The expansion of our reach worldwide is a testament to the global appreciation for Pakistan's rich cultural heritage.

Our courses are now taught by our talented alumni, who bring their expertise and passion for traditional arts, ensuring that we maintain the highest standards of education. The increasing interest in our programs has paved the way for the introduction of a one-year diploma program next year, a major step forward for us. As we continue to collaborate with new partners and collaborators, our mission to make VMCTA a leader in arts education remains strong.

Looking ahead, we are excited about the growth of both our vocational education programs and our traditional arts initiatives, and we remain committed to fostering excellence and preserving cultural heritage for future generations.

EMPOWERING SKILLS FOR SUCCESS

Since 1971, the Rangoonwala Trust has been empowering individuals through skill-building vocational programs. These initiatives have transformed the lives of nearly 500,000 students over the past five decades, equipping them with practical skills and valuable certifications. Although open to a broad range of learners, the programs particularly focus on women, offering them essential tools to excel in their chosen fields or start their own ventures. This setup allows students to explore diverse courses as they work toward their professional growth.

These programs are designed with flexibility, enabling students to enroll in multiple courses within a term. The Trust ensures that fees remain accessible, making it possible for people from various backgrounds to pursue their education here. Inclusivity is central to the Trust's philosophy, with special accommodations provided for individuals with disabilities. The Trust's mission is to foster education, character development, and personal growth, preparing graduates to succeed across different career paths in today's competitive world.





Archery

Culinary Arts

the next generation of artists. I feel so grateful to have





MODULES WE OFFER

TRADITION CERAMIC TILES

This module brings students into the world of traditional ceramics, focusing on regions like Multan, Thatta, Hala, and Lahore. Students will learn tile-making techniques such as plaster molds and tile pressing. In the pottery section, they will dive into the basics of bisque-ware ceramics and explore underglaze techniques. These skills come together to create both functional and decorative pieces, drawing inspiration from the Geometry and Biomorphic Design modules.













GEOMETRY PATTERNS DEVELOPMENT



In this module, students will explore the beauty of natural patterns and how geometry fits into traditional designs. They will learn to draw patterns based on symmetry found in nature, inspired by Pakistan's artistic heritage. This module introduces them to techniques like four-fold, six-fold, and twelve-fold symmetry, and how these designs are used in both two-dimensional and three-dimensional forms. Students will also dive into biomorphic design, where art and nature blend beautifully.



































METHODS & MATERIALS

This module gives students hands-on experience with creating natural colors. They'll learn the process of making dyes and pigments from natural materials like rocks, roots, and berries. We focus on traditional techniques used in Persian and Mughal art. Students will discover how to prepare pigments for watercolor, oil painting, and gilding. This module takes them through the history of these materials and teaches them how to apply them in various art forms.










ISLAMIC ILLUMINATION

Islamic Illumination, also known as Tehzip, is all about light and gold. In this module, students will learn the traditional technique of applying gold in decorative art. They will also explore miniature painting and fresco techniques, building on the skills learned in the Geometry and Methods & Materials modules. This course not only teaches how to create traditional patterns but also deepens their understanding of color harmony and symbolism in Islamic art.





IN STILLNESS WE MOVE

In Stillness We Move was a two-person exhibition by Emaan Pirzada and Nain Tara, exploring the relationship between self and space. This exhibition ran from *July 15 to August 5, 2023*. Pirzada used miniature techniques and letters to visually capture human connections within spaces, while Nain Tara's colorful abstractions conveyed emotions tied to the concept of home and displacement. Together, their works illuminated the emotional connections that spaces create in our lives.

Emaan Pirzada contemplates the inherent monotony of life within spaces using miniature techniques while simultaneously using and acknowledging the significance of various other materials. However, in her series "Whispers to Letters: A Visual Reverie," Pirzada transforms spaces into a visual language, drawing inspiration from written correspondences received from others. These letters serve as windows into the thoughts and experiences of various individuals, ultimately influencing Pirzada's artistic practice. By weaving together her own perspective with the stories shared by others, Pirzada's work captures the essence of human connection and the profound influence of spaces on our identities.

Nain Tara, through her bold strokes and colourful abstractions, delves deep into the emotions and challen ges associated with the concept of home and displacement. Through her visuals, she reflects on her personal experiences and memories tied to transitioning from one place to another. Each artwork becomes a vessel for an individual's feelings, employing child-like imagery in abstract reflections, representations, and experimentation. The use of such imagery serves to establish a profound connection between the viewers and Nain Tara's artwork, evoking a shared sense of vulnerability and nostalgia.

Through their respective and collaborative bodies of work, both artists illuminate the housing of perspectives, experiences, memories, and emotions within spaces.











TELLING STRUCTURES

VM Art Gallery hosted Telling Structures, a two-person exhibition featuring Ghazanfar Iqbal and Ozair Bin Mansoor. This show ran from *August 19 to September 5, 2023*. Ghazanfar Iqbal's works celebrated Pakistan's architectural heritage, while Ozair Bin Mansoor's pieces documented the balance between progress and preservation in Karachi's urban landscape. The exhibition invited viewers to appreciate architectural art from two generations' perspectives.

In this exhibition, the distinctive perspectives of two generations of artists (Ghazanfar Iqbal, a revered senior artist, and Ozair Bin Masoor, a talented young artist) and their voices have been juxtaposed in such a way that they offer a nuanced insight into the craft of architectural drawing. Ghazanfar and Ozair demonstrate how architectural drawings and paintings can transcend their physical forms, becoming windows into personal renditions, documentation, romanticism, nostalgia, historical narratives, and collective memory. The show prompts the viewers to explore the power and beauty of architectural art, engaging with the rich history, cultural significance, and social dynamics embedded within the structures that shape our cities.


Ghazanfar Iqbal's authentic and original works serve as gateways to explore the architectural heritage of Pakistan. He pays tribute to the nation's past and celebrates its vibrant culture. Using pen and oil on canvas, he masterfully captures the essence of Pakistan's historical cities, including Lahore, Karachi, and Peshawar. His paintings are not just physical representations but a manifestation of imagination, nostalgia, and deep appreciation for the resilience of these architectural marvels. Ghazanfar unravels the stories of these city architectures, weaving a narrative that spans decades and unveiling beauty that has withstood the tests of time.

In contrast, **Ozair Bin Masoor** takes a different approach, using drawings to un-layer the complex urban structures of Karachi. His works delve into the delicate balance between progress and preservation that lies within the city's chaotic energy. Ozair's drawings document and critique the environment, shedding light on the intertwining of modernity and tradition, growth and decay, chaos and order. By visually narrating the stories of buildings, he not only captures their essence and character, but also comments on the social, political, and economic factors that shape their development. Ozair's work symbolizes the ever-changing urban landscape, reflecting on the juxtapositions and complexities of Karachi's architectural morphology. The imperfections in his penon-paper drawings highlight the importance of preserving our architectural heritage amidst progress and decay.

Through their artistic prowess and deep appreciation for architectural art, Ghazanfar and Ozair decipher architectural narratives. This exhibition invites viewers to engage with architectural art from







SELF MOTIF

Self Motif showcased the works of Wajiha Batool, Talia Noor, and S. Khurram Abbas, running from *August 19 to September 5, 2023*. Each artist explored the concept of self within the medium of miniature art. Wajiha Batool used "Pardakht" techniques to reflect on personal experiences, S. Khurram Abbas addressed issues of identity and discrimination, and Talia Noor experimented with "Shamsa" patterns to express a range of ideas. The exhibition encouraged viewers to consider self-discovery, social issues, and traditional art forms.

In this exhibition, each artist is in pursuit of the self as they push and expand the boundaries of technique and expression within the context of miniature art. Drawing from traditional methods, they embark on a profound exploration of their observations, experiences, and the world around them.

Wajiha Batool's art in the exhibition takes inspiration from the traditional miniature painting technique known as "Pardakht," where the repetition of a single dot forms complex and intricate compositions. Embracing the symbolism of universal singularity and creation embodied in this technique, Wajiha delves deep into her introspective journey. Through her evocative pieces, Wajiha maps herself and contemplates the profound impact of significant life events and grapples with the void created by distance and loss. Her evocative pieces reflect the transformative power of personal experiences on one's sense of self.

In addition, **S. Khurram Abbas**, a trained miniature artist, explores the complexities of identity as a minority in Pakistan. He delves into the discrimination faced by the Pushtoon community and Shia Muslims in Pakistan, highlighting the lack of rights and the division within the nation. Through his thought-provoking paintings, which often draw from the poetry of renowned poets such as Faiz Ahmad Faiz and Habib Jalib, Khurram confronts these social issues and reflects on the power of art to shed light on inequality and discrimination.

Expanding on technique, **Talia Noor** uses the Shamsa, an old miniature design. The Shamsa, intricately decorated rosettes or medallions, finds its roots in Islamic art and is used in various contexts. Talia draws inspiration from the versatility of the Shamsa, allowing her to express a range of ideas. She challenges herself to recreate and capture its former glory, modifying it in different materials and textures, as seen in her collage work featuring Mughal figures.





THE PENWITH PORTFOLIO

VM Art Gallery presented The Penwith Portfolio, a collection of original prints by 12 renowned British modernists. The exhibition ran from September 19 to October 28, 2023, offering visitors an opportunity to study these works, which included lithographs and a screenprint. This exhibition provided a unique educational experience, featuring the artistry of figures such as Henry Moore, Barbara Hepworth, and Ben Nicholson.

The Penwith Society of Arts was founded in 1949 in St Ives, Cornwall, UK, by abstract artists who separated from the more conservative St Ives School. The society provided a platform for artists to challenge traditional boundaries and explore innovative approaches to art making.


The Penwith Portfolio was created in 1973 under the expert supervision of Stanley Jones at Curwen Press in London. It represents a unique collaboration between these esteemed artists and the Penwith Society of Arts. In August 1971, the Penwith Society of Arts acquired a subterranean car park adjacent to their gallery. The goal was to transform this space into a "permanent" exhibition showcasing prominent British Moderns associated with St. Ives, Cornwall. To fund the extensive conversion of the car park, the society organized various fundraising efforts, including the creation of the Penwith Portfolio.

Comprising of 11 lithographs and 1 screenprint, the portfolio features exquisite artworks that exemplify these artists' remarkable talent and innovation.

We were delighted to provide this unique opportunity for gallerygoers to appreciate and study these original prints as part of an enriching educational experience.


Through their works, these artists have not only opened enriched lines of inquiry but have also interconnected components of memories, lived realities, metaphors, and folklore, creating new worlds.

Through photography and storytelling, Abbas and Marijnissen shared their interpretations of identity, connection, and memory.

How we define 'belonging' varies broadly and entails a multitude of interpretations.

When we feel like we belong somewhere it creates a sense of home, a feeling of comfort. It offers a place of refuge and security. For most of us, it's where nurturing and intimacy begin. It shapes our identity and informs who we become. 'Home' is not always a physical place: Sometimes it's a feeling, a memory, a person. Photography can play a pivotal role in helping us understand the world around us.

The images, and the act of image-making, become part of the dialogue within ourselves and with others. By observing and documenting, we are able to receive and process what unfolds before us.

After meeting each other for the first time in a panel discussion on documentary photography, we continued our conversations on the importance of storytelling within our work. It was during this time that we discovered the similarities in our work. Both of us draw inspiration from our past, our childhood and most importantly our families. We connected through the shared experience of having lost our mothers. The challenges of motherhood or having lost the ability to become a mom.

Even though we come from different cultural and social backgrounds which greatly determine how we live through loss, the actual feeling transcends all boundaries. Grief or missing someone is universal.

Through our conversations, we discovered an interconnectedness and decided to engage in a photographic dialogue with our thoughts, feelings, images, video and texts. Exploring what it means to belong, long, become or be.

Zikr, Volume III, showcased the spiritual art of **Alefiya Abbas Ali** and **Saba Qureshi**. The exhibition ran from *March 18 to April 10, 2024*, with each artist presenting their reflections on Islamic faith and spirituality. Qureshi's work honored Palestine's resilience, while Abbas's pieces explored the "Breath of the Compassionate" pattern, symbolizing unity and harmony. Together, their works expressed a poignant call for compassion, unity, and faith.

Saba Qureshi's work is inspired by Islamic history, verses from the holy Quran, Hadith, and Sufi literature. The visual language she uses combines illustrated signs and symbols of prayer and devotion to Allah, sacred geometry, and biomorphic forms. Her body of work is dedicated to Palestine and the steadfast faith and perseverance they have shown the world in the face of immense suffering. In her view, their display of faith marks an important event in contemporary Islamic history, foretold by the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him), unfolding before our eyes and deserving our spiritual attention and respect.

Alefiya Abbas's work delves into the spiritual exploration of the "Breath of the Compassionate" pattern, drawing inspiration from Islamic and Judaic traditions. The concept encompasses the symbolic representation of harmony and unity through the pattern's symmetry and balance, as well as the deeper spiritual significance related to the Divine Breath as described in the teachings of Ibn al-'Arabi. The design serves as a reminder of the two stages of the soul, analogous to the expansion and contraction of the chest, and seeks to evoke the ideal concept of existence being synonymous with compassion, despite its occasional distance.

Together, their combined artistic expressions weave a narrative of spiritual exploration and profound contemplation. They serve as a poignant call for compassion, unity, peace, love and faith during these challenging times, with a dedicated focus on expressing solidarity with the people of Palestine.





Jawaan Champions is changing physical education in Pakistan, starting with schools in underserved areas of Karachi. Even with limited resources, we're helping students 65% of them girls, become champions through specially designed sports programs based on sports science. By training teachers in modern physical education methods, we ensure these programs can succeed, even in schools with fewer facilities. We focus on these areas because we see great potential. Through sports, students not only improve their health but also build leadership and resilience. With support from global partners like Youth Sport Trust International (YSTI), we aim to expand to 500 schools across the country, showing that every child can grow and lead through sports, no matter their background.

TRANSFORMING PHYSICAL AND MENTAL **WELL-BEING IN PAKISTAN**

The Jawaan Champions Programme is a groundbreaking initiative focused on revolutionizing physical education and promoting mental well-being among Pakistan's youth. Through creative modifications of traditional sports, the program strives to make physical activity more inclusive, accessible, and impactful across diverse environments, such as schools, detention centers, and rehabilitation facilities. The program's ultimate goal is to enhance health, fitness, and overall well-being in communities nationwide, working alongside educators to create sustainable, positive change.

Collaboration with Youth Sport Trust International (YSTI)


The partnership between Jawaan Champions and the Youth Sport Trust International (YSTI) has been crucial to advancing physical education (PE) in Pakistan. In a five-day intensive training program, master trainers received hands-on training and peer feedback, sharpening their teaching skills and elevating the standard of PE education across the country. This collaboration reflects a shared vision of nurturing a more active and healthier student population, setting the stage for long-term improvement in school-based physical education.



Partnership

Jawaan Champions has also partnered with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to extend its reach into underserved communities. This partnership emphasizes comprehensive teacher training and aims to incorporate physical education into JICA-sup ported schools, fostering the holistic develop ment of children.

One key milestone of the Jawaan Champions Programme has been the successful imple mentation of a Student Information Manage ment System (SMIS). This system allows for efficient tracking of student data, including academic performance, attendance, and program participation, ensuring resources are allocated effectively and the program's impact is accurately measured.



EVENTS

PHASE ONE INTERSCHOOLS **COMPETITION Grand Semi-Final** (Bovs)

Held on February 17, 2024, at St. Jude's High School, this event brought together 168 boys from twelve schools for a day of competitive sports. Teachers and a support team worked behind the scenes, helping to make the competition not only thrilling but also an opportunity for teamwork and sportsmanship. The event boosted school spirit and unity among students and staff.

PHASE ONE INTERSCHOOLS **COMPETITION Grand Semi-Final** (Girls)

On February 20, 2024, White House Grammar School hosted the girls' semi-final, with 166 participants from ten schools competing in a full-day tournament. With a strong focus on fitness and leadership, the event was a success, thanks to the dedication of 23 teachers and a support team who ensured smooth proceedings and inspired school pride.

PHASE ONE INTERSCHOOLS **COMPETITION Grand Final (Boys** & Girls) U-12 and U-14

The grand final took place on February 24, 2024, at St. Jude's High School, where 48 boys and 48 girls from top schools faced off. Over 200 guests, including educators and students, attended to cheer on the teams. Winners received shields and trophies, while all schools were awarded certificates. The event received excellent feedback, highlighting its impact on promoting sportsmanship among Karachi's youth.











TRAININGS

National Trainer's Training

The first National Trainers Training took place from September 11–15, 2023, at Dewa Institute for Special Children in Gulshan. This program aimed to create a team of skilled trainers in Pakistan, with two international experts, Ms. Viv and Sarah, guiding the 14 participants, including teachers from Phase One schools. Four participants graduated as National Trainers, and ten as Assistant National Trainers, marking a successful start to the initiative.

Teacher's Training

From November 24, 2023, to January 11, 2024, Phase Two teacher training was held at the TCF PKAK campus in Mauripur Town. This initiative, part of a larger network expansion, onboarded 30 schools into the JC Schools network, with 285 teachers participating from 133 schools across five Karachi towns. Led by 20 master trainers and 55 JC staff, the training focused on skills to enhance educational standards and integrate these schools more closely with JC's quality benchmarks.

Monitoring & Evaluation

On June 1–2, 2024, a two-day Monitoring & Evaluation training was held at the Jawaan Champions Training Centre, providing 30 partner schools with skills for effective program oversight and data entry. The event, attended by 20 principals and 40 teachers, included hands-on guidance in monitoring frameworks and SMIS data management. Participants appreciated the practical resources and training quality, reporting a positive experience and readiness to apply the skills in their schools.

Master Trainer Training Program

Held from June 23–27, 2024, this program at the Jawaan Champions Training Centre aimed to strengthen and expand the team of master trainers. Building on the training led by Ms. Viv and Sarah, this intensive five-day session provided advanced methods in curriculum development, leadership, and motivational techniques. With a cohort of 18—including four newly elevated trainers—participants

gained critical skills despite minor logistical challenges, and the program ended with a celebratory certification ceremony, reinforcing the Trust's commitment to educational excellence.







SUCCESS STORIES

At a small, bustling school without a playground, students faced a big challenge: they had nowhere to play their new favorite game, rounders, introduced by Jawaan Champions. But they didn't let this stop them. For six months, they practiced on a blackboard, turning their classroom into a space of creativity and determination. When they finally took to a real playground, their dedication paid off, showing how resilience and ingenuity can turn obstacles into stepping stones. Their journey proved that the drive to learn and adapt can lead to triumphs that inspire others.

When St. Jude's High School in North Nazimabad partnered with Jawaan Champions, they hoped to enhance their students' well-being. What they didn't expect was a transformation in their school culture and reputation. By integrating the "Active Schools" program, they saw increased applications as parents valued a school committed to both physical and mental growth. For the first time, girls were seen excelling on the field, challenging norms and inspiring change within the community. "We never imagined adding 'Active School' to our brochure would make such a difference," said Principal Vincent Thomas. "Our students are happier, healthier, and performing better. And the best part? Our classrooms are filling up with eager young minds.



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PROJECTS

The Rangoonwala Community Centre partnerships represent a collection of collaborations aimed at uplifting underprivileged communities through healthcare, education, and social welfare. These partnerships involve a diverse collaboration of organizations dedicated to providing essential services, from medical care at Indus Hospital and the Layton Rehmatullah Benevolent Trust to educational support through institutions like the Citizen Foundation and NASRA School. Additionally, efforts such as the Dhoraji Khidmat Committee's eye care programs and the Karachi Relief Trust's affordable housing projects are crucial in addressing the fundamental needs of those in rural and urban communities. Each partnership plays a key role in promoting community development, fostering leadership, and offering support where it is most needed.

INDUS HOSPITAL:

The Indus Hospital project came into being in 2005 when a committed group of doctors, philanthropists, and businessmen came together to support underprivileged communities by creating a modern, free hospital. It was officially registered on 23 June 2008 as a Guarantee imited Company under Section 42 of the Companies Ordinance 1984, with its office located in Korangi, Karachi.



The hospital serves the entire city, specifically helping around 3 million people living in areas like Saddar Town, Defence Housing Society, Korangi, and Landhi. Dr. Abdul Bari Khan has been managing the project since 2007. Due to the increasing number of patients, the hospital plans to expand from 150 to 1800 beds over the next 10 years. The goal of Indus Hospital is to provide free, comprehensive medical care to patients, aiming to build a large hospital that offers a full range of services to meet the growing demand.

SCHOLARSHIPS TO VARIOUS STUDENTS:

Applications from students across the city have been submitted for financial help with school fees. A total of 438 applications have been reviewed by the Housing & Education Committee of the ZVMG Rangoonwala Trust.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD:

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Programme in Pakistan is designed to help young people aged 13.5 to 24 develop themselves. Young participants can enroll for Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards by participating in four areas i.e., Service, Physical Recreation, Skills, and an Adventurous Journey/Expedition. After completing the program, they receive a certificate signed by HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh. The corporate sector in Pakistan recognizes the value of this program for nation-building, and twelve companies make up the Board of Trustees.

DHORAJI FOUNDATION:

The Dhoraji Foundation is a charity group that helps poor and deserving people, focusing especially on the Dhoraji community. It started in 1983 and was updated in 2002. Its main goal is to provide education and medical help to those in need Important members of the community are part of the board running the foundation.

DHORAJI ASSOCIATION:

The Dhoraji Association began in Karachi in 1951 as a charity to help poor people, especially from the Dhoraji community. Its goals are to support schools, improve the economy, and take care of elderly, poor, and needy people.

DHORAJI KHIDMAT:

The Dhoraji Khidmat Committee started in 1973 and is registered under the law. Its office is in Dhoraji Colony, Karachi. The committee's main work is to help people with eye problems who cannot afford treatment. It helps with cataract surgeries and provides eyeglasses either at a low cost or free. Over the last 7 years, it has helped many patients.





DHORAJI YOUTH SERVICE FOUNDATION:

The Dhoraji Youth Service Foundation is a nonprofit group formed in 1990. It is focused on supporting education and healthcare for the community. It offers scholarships to students based on merit and financial need, provides career counseling, and gives financial help for higher education in various fields.

KARACHI RELIEF TRUST (KRT):

The Karachi Relief Trust builds affordable homes in rural and urban areas. Their team includes architects, project managers, engineers, and other professionals who volunteer their time. KRT will rebuild homes near TCF schools to help children continue their education. Indus Hospital is also thinking about providing health services in these areas.

THE HEALTH FOUNDATION:

The Health Foundation was set up on 24 August 2007. Its main goal is to run clinics, hospitals, and health centers to treat and prevent diseases like Hepatitis, AIDS, Typhoid, and Tuberculosis. It provides medicine, vaccines, and free treatment to patients who can't afford it. The foundation is also part of global health organizations.



EDUCATIONAL TRUST NASRA:

The Education Trust Nasra Schools (ETNS) started in 1949 to offer good education to children from poor families. Since then, ETNS has helped thousands of children continue their studies, even if they have money problems. Nasra Schools now have five campuses i low-income areas, teaching more than 10,000 students. Many of these students receive scholarships.

M. A. RANGOONWALA HELPERS - QUETTA:

The Helpers Association of Pakistan (HAP) was started in 1978 to focus on improving education and healthcare, especially in Baluchistan. It runs schools and centers that provide basic education and job training for women and children, helping them improve their lives.

THE CITIZEN FOUNDATION (TCF):

The Citizen Foundation (TCF) is a non-profit group in Pakistan that gives quality education to children from poor backgrounds. Started in 1995, TCF works in both rural areas and city slums, helping children who have little access to schools.

FESF (HYDERABAD):


The Family Education Services Foundation (FESF) is a non-profit organization that focuses on education. It runs the Deaf Reach Program, which has schools and training centers for deaf students. These schools offer free education and extra courses in IT, art, and other skills, helping deaf children from poor backgrounds.


Raising Health Awareness for a Better Future

Women's Day Event


Celebrating Women at RCC
